- A valid CDL-A driver's license with air brake endorsement (No permits will be accepted)
- Original Social Security Card
- Resume
- Original high school diploma, G.E.D. or original transcript in a sealed envelope from the educational institution. Absolutely no copies will be accepted. If you have a transcript, DO NOT make a copy, copies will be made when you apply.
- Be at least 18 years of age
- Cashier's check or money order in the amount of \$25.00 made payable to IBEW Local 9 Apprenticeship Fund. NO personal checks will be accepted.

Study Guides will be available for \$20.00. Please bring a separate cashier's check or money order. **NO** personal checks or cash will be accepted.
